



Michał Baczyński was born in Katowice, Poland. He received the M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees in mathematics from the Department of Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry, University of Silesia, Katowice, in 1995 and 2000, respectively. He received the “habilitation” degree in computer science from the Systems Research Institute, Polish Academy of Sciences, Warsaw, Poland, in 2010.

He is currently with the Institute of Mathematics, University of Silesia. He has co-authored a research monograph on Fuzzy Implications and is the author or co-author of more than 40 published papers in refereed international journals and conferences. He has been invited to be an invited speaker for 2 international conferences, in particular at last EUSFLAT - LFA 2011 Conference in Aix-Les-Bains, France. He is also a regular reviewer for many respected international journals and a member of various committees in international conferences.

His current research interests include fuzzy aggregation operations, chiefly fuzzy implications, approximate reasoning, fuzzy systems, and functional equations. Dr. Baczyński is a member of the European Society for Fuzzy Logic and Technology (EUSFLAT) and the Polish Mathematical Society (PTM).
